

We thank all of you for getting started on Project Linus ahead of time. We hope that our love and creations will be in a home for many and that our contributions will be brought with comfort and thankfulness.

Project Linus this year is about Heroes!

Whether they are Marvel Comics, Disney or even our real everyday emergency heroes, with all the events happening today, we thank you for being a part of our project in efforts to help those effected by such events.

Part of this course is to challenge yourself with ideas, colours, and go beyond the instructions. Here is how we are ALL going to help you enjoy yourself and feel much more confident with expressing your creativity.

We have asked you to add your amazing squares on a pile for all to take part and enjoy.

Step one, choose 4 squares, your theme, colour etc. Be different, don't choose your own squares but choose others. We want each afghan to display the true heart of ALL of us working together for a common cause. A little bit of ALL our love.

Recommended 4 squares the same size. You can go larger with more squares if you wish. Let everyone get at least 4 squares first.



Step two, you can choose your yarn. Please be mindful, JOANN.com has provided us a wonderful amount of 'community yarn' that we can all share. Choose two balls. Throughout the week, if you do not use the entire ball, you can add it back to the community stash for others to enjoy.

We have included books on borders and joining techniques plus some samples here in this cruise pattern book.

You can either, continue with creating more fun with a border on each square or you can connect the squares as is. Whether that is sewing them together or discovering a whole new technique. Ask your neighbour, learn from each other. Never be afraid to ask.

Be creative, the books are here to give you ideas. If you are struggling with pattern reading, let us help you. Ask a neighbour. We plan to explore what does it mean by multiplies, stitch counts etc. Now for the amazing FUN part! We are adding fabric to the back of each afghan. We will be showing you how to add the fabric without sewing. Once your fabric is attached, you can continue explore border ideas. Make each afghan your very best!

Tools Needed - *Provided by JOANN.com*

Rotary cutter, fabric cutting board, straight edge, measuring tape, scissors, skip cutter and small crochet hook in your activity packages

Prepare Your Fleece

Choose your fleece colour. Pair with an existing blanket or big enough to do a dedicated fleece blanket with a crochet border.

Using the rotary cutter, cut the fleece extra 1" per side. In the corners, cut a diagonal out that is approximately 1" x 1" from the corner. This prevents bunching of corners when folding the fabric .

Measuring 1" from each edge, use the skip cutter, pressing **FIRMLY** rolling across. DO NOT GO OVER MORE THAN ONCE or you will ruin your fleece. Use your Ruler as a guide.



Crocheting into Fleece

Looking at the good side of the fleece. Fold the edge away from you to the back side.

Using a smaller crochet hook, **3.5 mm or F Hook** and the same yarn you are using with your project and/or other medium (4) weight yarn, insert hook into the first hole at the meeting points of where the skip cutter holes intersect at a corner. It's about 1" from top edge and side edge.

Join yarn with a slip stitch, ch 1, 1 sc in same hole. *Ch 1, sc in next hole. Continue to * around. In corners, 3 sc. Be sure to stop where the next skip cutter holes are on the next side. Rotating your project and folding over the next edge as you crochet. Continue all the way around. Fasten off, weave in ends. You may have to 'feel' the holes from time to time if you cannot see them.



How to Add Fleece to Crochet Projects

Attaching to the Fleece your Crochet Blanket

After crocheting a border edge to the fleece, lay the crochet project you want to join the fleece to right side down.

Lay the fleece project on top of the crochet project right side up.

Lift up the two panels together as if they are one and the crochet project should be facing towards you with the fleece on the other side.

Insert hook using the same size hook you were using for your crochet project. Insert through both pieces at the same time and join with a single crochet. For the fleece side, only crochet into the single crochet stitches. Skip over the ch-1 spaces.

Ensure to look ahead to ensure the fleece is matching up all the way to the other corner. In the case you are slightly too big or too small, just stretch the project out and align with your stitches as you crochet. If you are too big for the fleece, don't be afraid to advance stitches on the crochet side but go into the same stitch on the fleece side. This will change the distance. Be random to prevent buckling. Other words, use your eyes and adjust when needed.

Once you join, you can continue to add more to the border if you wish. Be creative and have fun. We purchased books for you to have a blast with and the ideas are endless!

Consider the border as a multiple of 1 unless you want to count the stitches around to make other decisions. You can add as many rounds as you wish.

- 3 Big Twist Premium
- Crochet Hook 5.5mm, Size I

Gauge 13 sc and 14 rows = 4 ins (10cm)

Stitch Glossary

RS = Right side

Sc = Single crochet

Sl st = Slip stitch

Sp(s) = Space(s)

St(s) = Stitch(es)

Tog = Together

WS = Wrong side

Yoh = Yarn over hook

INSTRUCTIONS

With Color 1, ch 4. Join with sl st to first ch to form ring.

1st rnd: Ch 3. 11 dc in ring. Join with sl st to top of ch-3. 12 dc.

2nd rnd: Ch 3. 2 dc in each dc around. Join with sl st to top of ch-3. 24 dc.

3rd rnd: Ch 3. 1 dc in same sp as sl st (counts as 2 dc). *1 dc in next dc. 2 dc in next dc. Rep from * to last dc. 1 dc in last dc. Join with sl st to top of ch-3. 36 dc.

4th rnd: Ch 3. 1 dc in same sp as sl st (counts as 2 dc). *1 dc in each of next 2 dc. 2 dc in next dc. Rep from * to last 2 dc. 1 dc in each of last 2 dc. Join with sl st to top of ch-3. 48 dc.

5th rnd: Ch 3. (1 dc. Ch 1. 2 dc) in same sp as sl st (counts as shell). *Skip next 2 dc. (2 dc. Ch 1. 2 dc) in next dc – shell made. Rep from * around. Join with sl st to top of ch-3. 16 shells.

6th rnd: Sl st in next dc and ch-1 sp. Ch 3. (1 dc. Ch 1. 2 dc) in same sp as last sl st. *(2 dc. Ch 1. 2 dc) in next ch-1 sp. Rep from * around. Join with sl st to top of ch-3.

7th rnd: Sl st in next dc and ch-1 sp. Ch 3. (2 dc. Ch 1. 3 dc) in same sp as last sl st. *(3 dc. Ch 1. 3 dc) in next ch-1 sp. Rep from * around. Join with sl st to top of ch-3.

8th rnd: Sl st in each of next 2 dc and ch-1 sp. Ch 3. (2 dc. Ch 1. 3 dc) in same sp as last sl st. *(3 dc. Ch 1. 3 dc) in next ch-1 sp. Rep from * around. Join with sl st to top of ch-3. Fasten off.

9th rnd: Join Color 2 with sl st to any ch-1 sp. Ch 3. (3 dc. Ch 1. 4 dc) in same sp as last sl st. *(4 dc. Ch 1. 4 dc) in next ch-1 sp. Rep from * around. Join with sl st to top of ch-3.

10th rnd: Sl st in each of next 3 dc and ch-1 sp. Ch 3. (3 dc. Ch 1. 4 dc) in same sp as last sl st. *(4 dc. Ch 1. 4 dc) in next ch-1 sp. Rep from * around. Join with sl st to top of ch-3.

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11th rnd: Sl st in each of next 3 dc and ch-1 sp. Ch 3. (4 dc. Ch 1. 5 dc) in same sp as last sl st. *Ch 1. (5 dc. Ch 1. 5 dc) in next ch-1 sp. Rep from * around. Join Color 3 with sl st to top of ch-3.



12th rnd: With Color 3, ch 1. 1 sc in same sp as last sl st. (Ch 1. 1 sc in next dc) 4 times. Ch 1. 1 sc in next ch-1 sp. *(Ch 1. 1 sc in next dc) 5 times. Ch 1. 1 sc in next ch-1 sp. Ch 1. (1 sc in sp between next 2 shells 1 row below. Ch 1) 6 times.** 1 sc in same sp as last sc. (Ch 1. 1 sc in sp between next 2 shells 1 row above) 6 times. (Ch 1. 1 sc in next dc) 5 times. Rep from * around, ending at **. Ch 1. Join with sl st to first sc.

13th rnd: Ch 2. (Skip first sc. Yoh and draw up a loop in next ch-1 sp. Yoh and draw through 2 loops on hook) twice. Yoh and draw through all loops on hook – beg dc3tog made. *(1 sc in next sc. 1 sc in next ch-1 sp) 6 times. (Skip next sc. Yoh and draw up a loop in next ch-1 sp. Yoh and draw through 2 loops on hook 3 times. Yoh and draw through all loops on hook. Skip next sc. (Skip next sc. Yoh and draw up a loop in next ch-1 sp. Yoh and draw through 2 loops on hook) 3 times. Yoh and draw through all loops on hook – dc3tog made. Rep from * around. Join with sl st to first st.

14th rnd: Ch 2 (does not count as hdc). 1 hdc in same sp as last sl st. 1 hdc in each of next 2 sc. *1 sc in each of next 8 sc. 1 hdc in each of next 6 sts. Rep from * around. Join with sl st to first hdc. Fasten off.

FINISHING

With WS tog, join C with sl st to any sc. Ch 1. Working through both thicknesses, work 1 sc in each st around, insert pillow form at halfway point and cont around to end. Join with sl st to first sc. Fasten off.

Pillow is worked in Rnds from 1st to 5th rnds. Switch to working in rows after 5th rnds.

INSTRUCTIONS

Make 2, Front and Back (make alike) 14" pillow form

With MC, Ch 4, join with sl st to first ch to form ring

1st rnd: Ch 1. 10 sc in ring. Join with sl st to first sc.

2nd rnd: Ch 3 (counts as dc). 3dc in same sp as sl st. Drop loop from hook, insert hook in 3rd ch of ch3 and pull dropped loop through – first popcorn made.*Ch1. 4 dc in next sc. Drop loop from hook, insert hook in first dc of 4 dc group and pull dropped loop through – popcorn made. Rep from * around. Ch1. Join with sl st to top of first popcorn. - 10 popcorns.

3rd rnd: Ch 3 (counts as dc). First popcorn in same sp as sl st. *Ch1. Popcorn in next ch-1 sp. Popcorn in next popcorn. Rep from * around, ending with: Popcorn in last ch-1 sp. Join with sl st to top of first popcorn. - 20 popcorns.

4th rnd: Ch 1. *1 sc in each of next 3 sts. 2 sc in next st. Rep from * around. Join with sl st to first sc. - 50sc.

5th rnd: *Ch 7. 1 sc in 2nd ch from hook. 1 sc in each of next 5 ch. Sl st in next sc. 1 sc in next sc. Rep from * 23 times more. Ch 7. 1 sc in 2nd ch from hook. 1 sc in each of next 5ch. Sl st in last sc. Join with sl st to first sc. - 25 points.

Beg working in rows:

1st row: Ch 1. * Working in rem loops of foundation ch, 1 sc in same sp as sl st. 1 sc in each of next 6 ch. (1 sc. Ch 1. 1 sc) inside of last sc. 1 sc in each of next 6 ch. Miss next sl st and sc. Rep from * around. Join with sl st to first sc. Turn.

2nd row: Miss first sc. * Working in back loops only, 1 sc in each of next 6 sc. (1 sc. Ch 2. 1 sc) in next ch-1 sp. 1 sc in each of

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next 6 sc. Miss next 2 sc. Rep from * around, ending with: 1 sc in each of next 6 sc. Miss next sc. Join with sl st to first sc. Turn.

3rd row: Miss first sc. * Working in back loops only, 1sc in each of next 6 sc. (1 sc. Ch 2 . 1 sc) in next ch-2 sp. 1 sc in each of next 6 sc. Miss next 2 sc. Rep from * around, ending with 1 sc in each of next 6 sc. Miss next sc. Join with sl st of first sc. Turn. 3rd row forms pat.


Cont un pat in following colour sequence 2 rows MC, 2rows A, 3 rows B. Fasten off.



Finishing Sew in front and back tog throught back loops, matching points of Front with valleys of Back and leaving opening for a pillow form. Insert pillow form. Sew rem opening closed.

INSTRUCTIONS

Ch 104; sl st to 1st st to form ring, being careful not to twist the ch.

Rnd 1: Ch 1, sc in each ch around; sl st to 1st sc. (104 sc)

Rnd 2: Ch 3 (counts as dc now and throughout), dc in next 2 st, *ch 2, sk 2 st, dc in next 3 st*; rep * * 3 times, **ch 2, sk 2 st, dc in next 2, dc-ch 3-dc in next st**, dc in next 2, rep * * 9 times, rep ** ** once, rep * * 4 times, ch 2, sl st to ch 3. (36 dc, 20 ch-2 sp, 2 ch-3 sp) TURN

Rnd 3: Sl st into ch-2 sp, ch 3, 2 dc, *ch 2, 3 dc in next ch-2 sp, rep * to ch- 3, 3 dc-ch 3- 3 dc in ch-3, rep * again to ch-3, 3 dc-ch 3- 3 dc, rep * to last sp, ch 2, sl st to ch 3. (42 dc, 22 ch-2 sp, 2 ch-3). TURN.

Repeat rnd 3 until desired length. Each row increases 6 dc and 2 ch-2 sps.

I made mine 29 rounds and it fits a size large. You can either shorten it or lengthen it to size it as you desire. Making it bigger will require more yarn. - Jeanne

INSTRUCTIONS

To Begin: Ch 96, sl st to 1st ch to form ring, taking care not to twist the ch.

Rnd 1: Ch 1, sc in each ch around, sl st to beg sc. -- 96 sc

Rnd 2: Ch 2, dc in same st, dc in next 47 sts, (2 dc ch2 2 dc) in next st, dc in next 47 sts, 2 dc in same st as first 2 dc, ch 1, sc to top of beg ch 2. -- 102 dc

Rnd 3: Ch 2, dc in same sp, dc in each st to next ch-2 sp, (2 dc ch 2 2 dc) in ch-2 sp, dc in each st to beg sp, 2 dc in sp, ch 1, sc to top of beg ch 2. -- 110 dc

Rnd 4: Ch 2, dc in same sp, FPdc in next st *dc in next st, FPdc in next st: rep * to corner, (2 dc ch 2 2 dc), FPdc in next st, rep * again to beg sp, 2 dc in sp, ch 1, sc to top of beg ch 2. -- 118 sts

Pattern Repeat:

Rnd 5 & 6: Rep Rnd 3

Rnd 7: Rep Rnd 4

Continue pattern repeat for 34 rounds.

Rnd 35: Rep Rnd 3. TURN.

Rnd 36: Ch 1, 2 sc in sp, sc in each st to corner, 3 sc in ch-2 sp, sc in each st to beg, sc in sp, sl st to beg sc. TURN.

Rnd 37: Ch 1, *(sc, ch 3, sc) in first st, sk st; rep * around, sl st to beg sc. Finish off.



Stitch Glossary

ch = Chain
 Sc = Single crochet
 Sl st = Slip stitch

 FPdc = Front Post Double Crochet

Special Stitch: Puff stitch - Yo, pull up a lp, yo, pull up a lp, yo, pull up a lp, (should be 7 lps on hook), yo, pull thru 6 lps on hook, yo pull thru last 2



Bottom of Bag

Ch 5, sl st in first ch to form a ring.

Rnd 1 - Ch 3, into ring, 3 dc, ch 2, 4 dc, ch 2, 4 dc, ch 2, 4 dc, ch 1, sc to beg ch-3.

Rnd 2 - Ch 2, dc in sp, dc in each st to corner, (2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in ch-2 sp, rep all 4 sides to beg sp, 2 dc, ch 1, sc to beg ch-2.

Rnd 3 thru 10 - Rep rnd 2.

Begin chevron. You will be skipping 4 sts in the middle of each side to form the valley of the chevron. You may also want to start changing colors to stripe as desired.

Rnd 11 - Ch 2, dc in sp, *FPdc next st, dc in next st; rep * 8 more times, sk 4 sts, **dc in next st, FPdc in next st; rep ** to corner (2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in ch-2 sp, rep from * all 4 sides to beg sp, 2 dc, ch 1, sc to beg ch-2.

Rnd 12 - Ch 2, dc in sp, dc in next 18 sts, sk 4 sts, dc in next 18 sts to corner (2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in ch-2 sp; rep all 4 sides to beg sp, 2 dc, ch 1, sc to beg ch-2.

Rnd 13 thru 22 - Rep rnds 11 and 12.

Rnd 23 - Rep rnd 11.

Rnd 24 - Ch 2, dc in sp, *dc in next st, puff st in next st, dc in next st; rep * 5 more times, sk 4 sts, rep * 6 more times to corner (2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in ch-2 sp; rep all 4 sides to beg sp, 2 dc, ch 1, sc to beg ch-2.

Rnd 25 - Ch 1, sc in sp, sc in next 18 sts, sk 4 sts, sc in next 18 sts to corner, 3 sc in ch-2 sp, rep all 4 sides to beg sp, 2 sc in sp, sl st to beg sc. Break yarn.

Handles

Attach yarn with a sl st, one st to the right of any 3 sc corner group.

Handle row 1 - Ch 3, dc in next 4 sts. Turn.
Row 2 thru 30 - Ch 3, dc each st across. Turn.

Match stitches to the next corner and sl st to attach handle to corner. Repeat handle on next 2 corners.



INSTRUCTIONS

Body of bag is constructed by making 3 join as you go modern granny squares. The handle is worked right along with the border rounds.

First Square.

With MC, ch 5, sl st to form ring.

Round 1: Ch 3 (counts as first dc here and throughout), 2 dc in ring, ch 1, [3 dc in ring, ch 1] 3 times; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—Four 3-dc groups, and 4 ch-1 sps.

Round 2: Sl st in next 2 dc, [(sc, ch 3, sc) in next ch-1 sp (corner made), ch 3] 4 times; join with sl st in first sc—4 corners, 4 ch-3 sps.

Round 3: (Sl st, ch 3, 2 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in first corner ch-3 sp, 3 dc in next ch-3 sp, [(3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in next corner ch-3 sp, 3 dc in next ch-3 sp] 3 times; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—4 corners, and four 3-dc groups.

Round 4: Sl st in next 2 dc, *(sc, ch 3, sc) in next corner ch-1 sp, ch 3, sc in next space between corner and next 3-dc group, ch 3, sc in next space between next 3-dc group and corner, ch 3; repeat from * 3 more times; join with sl st in first sc—4 corners, and 12 ch-3 sps.

Round 5: (Sl st, ch 3, 2 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in first corner ch-3 sp, 3 dc in next 3 ch-3 sp, *(3 dc, ch 1, 3 dc) in next corner ch-3 sp, 3 dc in next 3 ch-3 sp; repeat from * 2 more times; join with sl st in top of beginning ch—4 corners, and twelve 3-dc groups.

Round 6: Sl st in next 2 dc, *(sc, ch 3, sc) in next corner ch-1 sp, ch 3, [sc in next space between 3-dc groups, ch 3] to next corner ch-1 sp; repeat from * 3 more times; join with sl st in first sc—4 corners, and 20 ch-3 sps.

Round 7 – CC – Continue in pattern as in round 5.

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Round 8 thru 11 – MC – Continue in pattern alternating rounds 6 and 5.

Round 12 – CC – Continue in pattern as in round 6.

Repeat thru round 11 for second and third squares. Use Join as You Go method to attach squares with round 12.

Join-As-You-Go – Attach CC in corner, (sc, ch 3, sc) in next corner ch-1 sp, ch 3, [sc in next space between 3-dc groups, ch 3] to next corner ch-1 sp, [sc, ch 1, sc to the corner of first square, ch 1, sc, in corner ch-1 sp] (first join created), *ch 1, sc to next ch-3 sp of first square, ch 1, sc in next space between next 3-dc group; *repeat to next corner and join corner the same as first corner. Continue around the rest of the square as in round 4 and finish off.

Edging

With MC, attach with sl st in one of the upper corners, ch 1, sc in same sp, *3 dc in next ch-3 sp, rep * 10 more times, dc in next ch-3 sp, dc2tog using same sp and the next sp, dc in same sp, rep * 11 times, 3 sc in corner; rep * again on back side of bag to beg corner, 2 sc, sl st to beg sc and sl st in next dc. Turn.

Handle

Row 1 - Ch 3, dc in next 4 sts. Turn.

Rep row 1 until desired length. Mine is 36 rows. Break MC.

Final Edge

Attach CC in first dc next to handle, ch 1, sc in same st, sc in next 28 sts, in valley, hdc, hdc, dc5tog, hdc, hdc, sc in next 29 sts, continue up handle by placing 2 sc around the dc of each row, sl st to beg sc. Break yarn – rep on back side of bag. Finish off.

What to Bring

Pattern for Wicked Step Stitches Cruise

- 1 Ball Big Twist White/Black
- Crochet Hook 5 mm, Size H

Worked in a continuous round.

Main Body

With MC, ch 4. Join with sl st to first ch to form ring.

1st rnd: Ch 1, 8 sc in ring. Place stitch marker at the 8th sc to mark the rounds. When finished each round, move the stitch marker up to keep track of the revolutions.

2nd rnd: 2 sc in each.

3rd rnd: *2 sc in next st, 1 sc in next. Repeat * around.

4 - 6th rnd: 1 sc in each st.

7th rnd: *2 sc tog, 1 sc in next. Repeat * around.

8 - 10th rnd: 1 sc in each st.

11th rnd: *2 sc tog, 1 sc in next. Repeat * around.

12th rnd: 2 sc in each.

13 - 15th rnd: 1 sc in each st.

16th rnd: *2 sc in next st, 1 sc in next. Repeat * around.

17 - 21st rnd: 1 sc in each st.

22nd rnd: *1 sc in next st, ch 3. 1 sc in same st. Repeat * around. Fasten off. Weave in ends.

Eye - Make 2

With A, ch 2.

1st rnd: 6 sc in 2nd chain from hook. Join with sl st to beg sc. Fasten off leaving tail to sew onto head of ghost.

Assembly Tips

Flatten ghost to position eyes. Sew on on front material. Do not sew right through the ghost as the glow stick needs to slide up through the head. Position eyes and sew.

Neck Chain

Using A, chain 90 or long enough chain to wrap around your neck. Leave long tail on both sides of the chain.

When wearing, slide the glow stick up through the head. Feed the chain through the eye of the glow stick. Tie the chain into a bow tie behind your neck. When ready, crack the glow stick and enjoy your light up ghost.



- Row 35 - Ch 3, dc in each st across. Turn.
- Row 36 - Ch 3, sk st, V-st in next st, *sk 2 dc, V-st; rep * to last 2 st, sk st, dc in last st. Turn.
- Row 37 - Ch 3, 3 dc in each ch-2 sp across, dc in last st. Turn.
- Row 38 thru 40 - Rep rows 35, 36, and 37.
- Row 41 - Rep row 35.
- Row 42 - Rep row 36.
- Edging - Row 43 - Ch 1, sc in first st, (sc, ch 1, sc, ch 1, sc) in each ch-2 sp across, sc in last st. Finish off.

3rd row: Ch 4 (counts as tr). 2 tr in first tr. *(Ch 1. Skip next tr. 1 tr in next tr) 4 times. Ch 1. Skip next tr. (2 tr. Ch 2. 2 tr) in next ch-2 sp. (Ch 1. Skip next tr. 1 tr in next tr) 4 times. Ch 1. Skip next tr. 3 tr in last tr. Turn. - 28 sts.

4th row: Ch 4 (counts as tr). 2 tr in first tr. 1 tr in each tr and ch-1 sp to ch-2 sp. (2 tr. Ch 2. 2 tr) in ch-2 sp. 1 tr in each tr and ch-1 sp to last tr. 3 tr in last tr. Turn. - 36 tr.

5th row: Ch 4 (counts as tr). 2 tr in first tr. 1 tr in each tr to ch-2 sp. (2 tr. Ch 2. 2 tr) in ch-2 sp. 1 tr in each tr to last tr. 3 tr in last tr. Turn. - 44 tr.

6th row: Ch 4 (counts as tr). 2 tr in first tr. *Ch 1. Skip next tr. 1 tr in next tr. Rep from * to ch-2 sp. (2 tr. Ch 2. 2 tr) in ch-2 sp. Ch 1. Skip next tr. 1 tr in next tr to last tr. 3 tr in last tr. Turn. - 52 sts.

7th to 14th rows: Rep 4th to 6th rows twice more, then 4th and 5th rows once. - 116 tr.

Break A and join B at end of last row.

With B, proceed as follows:

15th and 16th rows: Rep 6th row once, then 4th row once. 132 tr.

continue on next page

Break B and join C at end of last row.

With C, proceed as follows:

17th row: Ch 3 (counts as dc). 2 dc in first tr. 1 dc in each tr to ch-2 sp. (2 dc. Ch 2. 2 dc) in ch-2 sp. 1 dc in each tr to last tr. 3 dc in last tr. Turn. 140 dc.

18th row: Ch 5 (counts as dc. Ch 2). *1 dc in each of next 7 dc. Ch 2. Skip next 2 dc. Cluster in next dc. Ch 2. Skip next 2 dc. Rep from * 4 times more. 1 dc in each of next 7 dc. Ch 2. Skip next 2 dc. [(Cluster. Ch 1) twice. Cluster] in center ch-2 sp. **Ch 2. Skip next 2 dc. 1 dc in each of next 7 dc. Ch 2. Skip next 2 dc. Cluster in next dc. Rep from ** 4 times more. Ch 2. 1 dc in each of next 7 dc. Ch 2. 1 dc in last dc. Turn.

19th row: Ch 3 (counts as dc). (Cluster. Ch 2. Cluster) in first dc. *Ch 2. Skip next ch 2. 1 dc in sp between each of next 6 dc. Ch 2. Skip next ch 2. (Cluster. Ch 2. Cluster) in next cluster. Rep from * 5 times more. Ch 2. Skip next ch 1. (Cluster. Ch 2. Cluster) in top of next cluster. **Ch 2. Skip next ch 1. (Cluster. Ch 2. Cluster) in next cluster. Ch 2. Skip next ch 2. 1 dc in sp between each of next 6 dc. Rep from ** 5 times more. Ch 2. Skip next ch 2. (Cluster. Ch 2. Cluster. 1 dc) in last dc. Turn.

20th row: Ch 6 (counts as dc. Ch 3). (Cluster. Ch 2. Cluster) in first ch-2 sp. *Ch 3. Skip next ch 2. 1 dc in sp between each of next 5 dc. Ch 3. Skip next ch 2. (Cluster. Ch 2. Cluster) in next ch-2 sp. Rep from * 5 times more. Ch 3. (Cluster. Ch 2. Cluster) in center ch-2 sp. **Ch 3. Skip next ch 2. (Cluster. Ch 2. Cluster) in next ch-2 sp. Ch 3. 1 dc in sp between each of next 5 dc. Rep from ** 5 times more. Ch 3. Skip next ch 2. (Cluster. Ch 2. Cluster) in next ch-2 sp. Ch 3. 1 dc in last dc. Turn.



[(Cluster. Ch 2) twice. Cluster] in next ch-2 sp. Ch 3. Skip next ch 4. Rep from ** 5 times more. 2 dc in 3rd ch of beg ch-7. Turn.



Ch 2. Cluster) in next ch-2 sp. Rep from ** twice more. ***1 dc in sp between next 2 dc. (Cluster. Ch 2. Cluster) in next ch-2 sp. Ch 2. [(Cluster. Ch 2) twice. Cluster] in next ch-3 sp. Ch 2. 

INSTRUCTIONS

The instructions are written for smaller size. If changes are necessary for larger size the instructions will be written thus (). Numbers for each size are shown in the same color throughout the pattern. When only one number is given in black, it applies to both sizes.

Note: Ch 3 at beg of rnd counts as dc. Join all rnds with sl st to top of ch 3.

Beg at neck back edge, ch 56 (60). Join with sl st to first ch, taking care not to twist chain and do not chain too tightly as this foundation ch needs to pull over baby's head.

1st rnd: Ch 3. 1 dc in each of next 7 (8) ch. (1 dc. Ch 1. 1 dc – V st made) in next ch. 1 dc in each of next 10 ch. V st in next ch. 1 dc in each of next 16 (18) ch. V st in next ch. 1 dc in each of next 10 ch. V st in next ch. 1 dc in each of last 8 (9) ch. Join.

2nd to 9th (10th) rnds: Ch 3. *1 dc in each dc to ch-1 sp of next V st. V st in ch-1 sp of next V st. Rep from * 3 times more. 1 dc in each dc to end of rnd. Join. 124 (140) dc and 4 ch-1 sps at end of 9th (10th) rnd.

Divide Sleeves and Body:

Next rnd: Ch 3. 1 dc in each of next 16 (18) dc. 1 dc in ch-1 sp of next V st. Ch 3 for underarm. Skip next 28 (32) dc. 1 dc in ch-1 sp of next V st. 1 dc in each of next 34 (38) dc. 1 dc in ch-1 sp of next V st. Ch 3 for underarm. Skip next 28 (32) dc. 1 dc in ch-1 sp of next V st. 1 dc in each of last 17 (19) dc. Join.

Next rnd: Ch 3. 1 dc in each dc or ch around. Join. 78 (86) dc.

Next rnd: Ch 3. 1 dc in each dc around. Join. Rep last rnd until work from underarm ch measures 4 (5)" [10 (12.5) cm].

Next 5 rnds: Ch 2 (counts as first st). *Dc_{bp} around post of next st. Dc_{fp} around post of next st. Rep from * to last st. Dc_{bp} around post of last st. Join. Fasten off at end of 5th rnd.

Sleeves:

1st rnd: (RS). Join yarn with sl st to center of underarm ch. Ch 3. 1 dc in each ch or dc around. 31 (35) dc. Join.


2nd rnd: Ch 3. 1 dc in each dc around. Join. Rep last rnd until work from underarm chain measures 4 (5)" [10 (12.5) cm].

Next rnd: Ch 3. 1 dc in each of next 15 dc. Dc2tog. 1 dc in each dc to end of rnd. Join. 30 (34) dc.

Work from ** to ** as given for Body.

Neck edging: 1st rnd: (RS). Join yarn with sl st in center back rem ch of foundation ch. Ch 1. Work 1 sc in each rem ch around. Join with sl st to first sc.

2nd rnd: Ch 1. 1 sc in each sc around. Join with sl st to first sc. Fasten off.

5th row: Beg block. (Block) 4 times. Turn. 5 blocks.



Cont increasing 1 block each row, as established, until left side from beg measures 32" [81.5 cm].

Fasten off.
