## Mochilla Concept Practice: Key Card Holder

With help of Marion Verloop, expert of Mochilla concepts, we are going to explore Wayuu crochet concepts on board the cruise ship. Marion has provided us one of her bags to use as an example.

## Recommended Materials

(Will be supplied on the ship to you as well.)

2 mm Hook

Patons Grace, 1.75 oz/50 g. Use 4 colours of your choice.

This project is completed as a continuous round. Simply means there is no slip stitching. Use stitch marker to keep an eye on the counts.

The diagram shown is completed twice. There will be the same pattern on the back of the key card holder.

## Changing & Carrying Yarn Tips

Begin with main colour with chain. Once chain is established add in the other 3 colours to carry under the stitches when not in use.

This is completed as single crochet stitches. Remember, to change colour for the next stitch, the new colour has to be the colour that is pulled through the final 2 loops of the stitch before it.

The unused yarn is then carried on the top of the row below and you crochet directly over it to bury it. Pull tension taught.

Unlike typical tapestry, you should barely see the yarn being carried over due to hook

Using main colour, ch 34. Careful not to twist chain and join to beg ch to form loop.

Follow chart starting on rnd 1. You need to do the pattern graphic repeat once.

Rnd 1: 1 sc in each chain. Mark last st with stitch marker. Do not join.

Rnd 2: Add in rest of colour. Continue to sc using the colour scheme. Do not join.

Rnd 3+: Follow diagram and count. Change colours when required. Finish up end rnd 15.




## General Tip

- Hook size is important.
- Tension should be tight.
- Counting the diagram boxes is important.
- Use BACK LOOP ONLY.

Continue rnd 16 until diamond is in middle when folded in half. SI st final 2 stitches. Weave in all ends

Sew bottom seam shut.

Put lanyard through stitchwork at the 2 rows down in the middle.



Single crochet both bottom edge together at end.
