

## Crochet Classic Beret

The increase of 2 shifts from the beginning of a section to the middle of a section to keep the round circle perfect in every other round.

The yellow boxed (2) are where the 2 sc in same st increase is for each round.

Next 4 rounds are 1 sc in each st around.

**Let's look at an example, rnd 14.** I would count the first 6 sc, then place 2 sc in next st. To make it easier to follow, I would then count 12 sc instead of counting 6 + 6 before the next increase. I have placed the red numbers of the counts. At the end of the round, know you will have 6 left after the last increase.

It will make it easier to follow counting like this versus getting stuck if you are distracted.

Decreasing Rounds - 2sc2tog is where the sc decreases are.
