


Interlocking is using 2 yarns are the same time.
White used in rounds 1, 3, 5, 7 and 9 are to keep the yarns in front of the project when resting.

Keep 2, 4, 6, 8, 10 and 11 are the red, pink or gray used that frames the snowflake.

Jessie has us trapping the chains between rounds under the stitches but if you prefer no colour bleeding, push the chain behind the work.

Lighter blue in diagrams has the stitch behind the previous round and then jumps in front in the next stitch. This locks the rounds together.
